RE: PUBLIC HEARING –ANNEXATION, PETITIONERS SEAN & LAURIE BUTCHER – 0.7917 ACRES FROM PERRY TOWNSHIP TO THE CITY OF SALEM

Commissioner Halleck called the public hearing to order and those who were to testify were put under oath.

City of Salem Law Director, Attorney Brooke Zellers, spoke first in support of the annexation, stating the city has passed an ordinance for the necessary services. He stated they are concerned if the annexation is not allowed, that location will not have the services it needs, and the city will not be able to grow.

Mayor Dickey echoed Mr. Zellers statements and said the deed restriction clause on Ms. Butchers property is required to annex. She also spoke on the benefits of the annexation.

Perry Township Trustee Tony Ieropoli began with a letter Ms. Butcher received from the city to either annex or be disconnected from water/sewer. Residents want to stay in the township. This is going to be a domino effect if the annexation is allowed and will create an island of city property surrounded by township property. We ask that the annexation be denied.

Mr. Wayne Boyer, attorney for the petitioner Ms. Butcher, presented information regarding the annexation stating the mayor was accurate in some of her statements, but not all. The property in question is not contiguous to the city, as a portion of the road is not owned by Ms. Butcher or the city. Ms. Butcher has received multiple letters from the city threatening that if she doesn't annex, she will not receive any more utilities.

Ms. Laurie Butcher reiterated what her attorney said regarding the harsh letters she has received from the city threatening to shut off her water/sewer if she didn't comply. She even stated Mayor Dickey came on her porch, as she saw her on her ring camera. She has been dealing with this total stress for 1.5 years. As outlined by the trustees, our property is not the sole goal, they want the 32 additional properties. She only filed the annexation to keep her services. The city is bullying us as pawns for the other 32 properties.

Mr. Jeremy Corbisello allotted his time to Mr. Jim Foster. Mr. Foster presented "Exhibit 1" of signatures of the neighborhood against the annexation. He stated a few won't sign for fear of retaliation from the city or mayor in the future. This will have a domino effect with properties creating a checkboard skipping houses.

Mr. Leo Hickey, who has property on the south side of Beechwood stated it cost him a lot of money and took over a year to get his property annexed approved. He had no prior knowledge of deed restrictions, and he would love to give part of it back to the township to avoid this issue.

Perry Township Trustee Jim Armeni presented "Exhibit 2" showing maps and a statement prepared by the trustees. They do not feel this property is contiguous and does not meet the requirements for annexation.

Mr. Jay Turney said that he does not have a "dog in the fight", but wanted it known he is against the annexation. Where is the common sense......the people have spoken.

Commissioner Halleck said this is a shame and disgrace what this woman has been through and said Salem has a finite growth pattern.

Being no further business Commissioner Halleck adjourned the Commissioners regular meeting.
