Ms. Stevie Halverstadt informed the public of the Pancake Breakfast the Landmark Foundation is hosting to be held at the Lisbon Methodist Church on Saturday, February 15, 2025 from 8a-11a., in conjunction with an art contest, to be judged by the County Commissioners. The project for the Lisbon High School art students is Lady Justice. The event is in honor of the 222nd birthday of Lisbon, Founded February 16, 1803. She stated Lisbon is the second oldest town in Ohio

RE: 2ND PUBLIC HEARING - 1% SALES TAX RENEWAL

Commissioner Halleck opened the public hearing asking if anyone in favor of the sales tax would like to speak.

Ms. Stevie Halverstadt stated it is important to be passed, explaining her husband is a surveyor and he wouldn't be able to get his work done as it would affect all branches of the government, ie: recording deeds.

Commissioner Halleck explained over 70% of the general fund goes towards "justice", meaning the sheriff, the jail, the judges, and courts. He believes that the verbiage had a lot to do with it not being passed.

Former County Commissioner Dave Cranmer spoke, stating he left in 2002 when he was up against if the sales tax didn't pass. He did vote for the levy. "If I didn't support it, I would be a hypocrite". Nearly two of four years they struggled to pass at a time when they had to do a re-evaluation of real estate. We still have an issue with the re-evaluation now. He read parts of Resolution #35-2024, emphasizing the words additional revenue for the county and read parts of the ballot language. He recommended the Commissioners publish the entire resolution, so people know what they are voting for. If people don't know what they are voting for, they will vote no. People still call him asking questions. He asked if the county has or received parallel revenue with general or special funds, specifically referring to the oil and gas money. It was stated we have received approximately \$1 million to date. Mr. Cranmer stated he was for the sales tax.

Ms. Amanda Frost asked how much the total budget is compared to what the sales tax brings in. The total budget is approximately 23-24 million with the sales tax bringing in around 14 million.

Mr. Mark Steeb was concerned without the sales tax what services may not be available.

Commissioner Halleck explained even though there is 144 million in the bank, the largest amount of that is Columbiana County Board of Developmental Disabilities. The Commissioners only control about 20% of all funds. He went on to state we know everyone is mad about property taxes going up, myself included. The county gets very little on property taxes since the 2 mil went into effect in exchange for the sales tax and it needs to be renewed every five years. We are confident in our government.

Commissioner Ginter thanked Mr. Steeb and those who spoke, adding he doesn't believe it failed because of a lack of trust, he believes people were confused on the wording on the ballot and thought it was a new tax and not a renewal.

Commissioner Paparodis stated that over half of the revenue goes towards law enforcement, the sheriff's office, the courts and the judicial system. The need has grown exponentially for these services as everything has become more expensive to maintain.

Mr. Cranmer spoke again stating the inside 2 mil was a trade off with property owners of the county, to give something back to the people, in order to pass the ½% sales tax. He asked the commissioners not to do that with this one.

Commissioner Halleck agreed. He stated this was a healthy discussion and someone has to make up the shortfall. This is the fairest way to do that with the sales tax and we have other people helping us as we have people from WV and PA shopping in our county.

Ms. Peggy Caratelli felt the word additional was taken out of context and not meant additional on top of what we already have. The verbiage had a lot to do with not passing.

Commissioner Halleck explained the prosecutor's office prepares the resolution, we pass it as written, it is taken to the Board of Elections, they send it to the Secretary of State, then back to the Board of Elections. We can place blame, but that doesn't matter now. Going forward employees are still entitled to raises and can't be expected to live as paupers.
