RE: INVESTMENT ADVISORY BOARD MEETING - TREASURER BLAKEMAN

Present were: Commissioner Halleck, Commissioner Paparodis, Commissioner Ginter, Treasurer Bryan Blakeman, and Clerk of Courts Tony Dattilio. Jim McCourt of Meeder was also present.

Treasurer Bryan Blakeman opened the meeting stating the investments are very stable and the banking for the last several years has been paying off with higher interest rates.

Jim McCourt of Meeder reported the county portfolio is stable. He stated at the end of July, federal fund rates were expected to be lower to ensure meeting the goal to bring down inflation. In anticipation of rates going down, we should move money into the market. With a 5-year maturity, the last three years rates have been up. The Star Ohio account daily liquidity is \$27 million as of July 31st. Treasurer Blakeman stated the money in Star Ohio is enough to get us through a better part of the year, keeping 20-25 million on hand. We should recalibrate after the tax distribution as we don't want excessive liquidity. The Securities yield has grown substantially (over 50%), all in bonds and we reinvest as maturity comes due.

Commissioner Ginter questioned how does our asset allocation compare since he took office in January and Jim McCourt stated it doesn't swing widely quarter to quarter. The county overall for the past 4-5 years has kept in proper proportion, although there is a large spike in election years.

Looking towards 2027, the investment income projections in Securities will be pretty well insulated even if rates lowered. Meeder's job is to meet the needs of the county.

Treasurer Blakeman spoke regarding depository banks, one bank, JP Morgan, offered 2.5% interest locked in for six months with no fees and after six months there will be fees, but the interest will continue. He will continue to use Huntington Bank as a local depository and will set up to transfer money to JP.

Being no further business, Commissioner Halleck adjourned the Commissioners' regular meeting.
